Come to take a free tour, pose by the Corn Palace monument, and head across the street to pick up some corny mementos at the gift shop. The Native American history here is rich, with the park's name coming from the Lakota tribe's understanding that these lands lacked water and featured harsh weather and land that made it a tough environment to live in (the "badlands"). Crazy Horse Memorial James Dalrymple/Shutterstock South Dakota's massive Crazy Horse Memorial is located near Mount Rushmore and, though it's still under construction, will be over 563 feet tall (that's higher than a 60-story building) and 640 feet wide. South Dakota offers tourist attractions and rugged natural beauty in the center of the country. Above ground, you'll find lots of buffalo, prairie dogs, and other wildlife with great hiking and biking trails spanning 30 miles. Junior and Advanced Paleontology Classes are available for anyone interested in getting their hands dirty. The entire town is a National Historic Landmark and you'll find buildings, artifacts, and exhibits showcasing items from the late 1800s. It's easy to spend the whole day at the tumbling park when the weather is nice. It's a great place for the entire family! 12. New color bursts forward in the spring until everything is aglow in Spearfish Canyon throughout the summer. It was discovered in 1881 by a hunter who noticed a draft coming from a split in the rock. Every August (usually the first week), hundreds of thousands of people descend on the city of Sturgis near the Black Hills National Forest for the annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. Largest cities: Sioux Falls, Rapid City, Aberdeen, Brookings, Watertown, Mitchell, Huron, Spearfish, Yankton, Pierre, Vermillion, Sturgis, Belle Fourche, Brandon, Box Elder, Madison. Visitors can access scheduled bus rides to the base of the memorial throughout the day to meet Crazy Horse face-to-face. The creek has carved the gorge over millions of years and it's a truly beautiful spot in the South Dakota wilderness. There are hundreds of campgrounds, state parks, and national parks that offer prime camping spots across the state. It has a deep history in the area despite its relatively new status as a state park. Ranger-guided tours make this a really informative experience that people of all ages can appreciate. South Dakota is a vast state with rich Native American and colonial history, stunning scenery, famous monuments and landmarks, and beautiful parks. Falls Park Sopotnicki/Shutterstock If you'll be near Sioux Falls, you can't miss Falls Park! This natural area encompasses almost 130 acres along the Big Sioux River with a series of powerful, cascading falls winding through the rock formations. The Mammoth Site hosts all sorts of special events and weekly activities. It's a little bit silly, it's educational, and it's a long-standing beacon of Mitchell's agricultural richness that's been around since 1892. The Elk Mountain Campground at the national park sits among these above-ground surroundings and provides a less crowded experience than other campgrounds in the area. Tour galleries showcasing spiritual instruments, exploring how instruments have changed over time, global music, and the guitar and lute-making process that brings the instruments to life. The Butterfly House and Aquarium is open seven days a week between 10am and 4pm. Mundt National Wildlife Refuge to see bald eagles, especially in winter. Custer State Park boasts over 71,000 wildlife-packed acres in the Black Hills of South Dakota with some of the most popular trails, paths, and roads for hiking, biking, horseback riding, and scenic drives. The 0.6-mile Presidential Trail departs from the terrace, allowing visitors to get a closer look at the monument. Their event calendar includes things like family archaeology nights and Altal lessons. Wildlife, evergreen forests, lakes, canyons, mountains, hills, and prairies make South Dakota a truly stunning place to visit — especially when you head to any of the spots on our list. It sits in the prairie with beautiful, sprawling grounds that still contain the guard house, officers' quarters, and barracks from its military past. The head and upper body portion of revered Lakota leader Crazy Horse have been carved into this mountain, similar to the Mount Rushmore carvings just down the road. Head to Wall, South Dakota to check out its iconic old shop, Wall Drug. There are two visitor centers with tons of information about the park (Ben Reifel and White River) that make the perfect places to start your trip. Order your free copy today. It's a great spot for fishing and rock climbing if you're so inclined! While you're here, wander out to the observation platform that overlooks the 60-foot Bridal Veil Falls (it's an easy hike). This inhospitable scenery is strangely beautiful and one of South Dakota's most visited destinations. Mount Rushmore National Memorial is the number one tourist attraction in South Dakota, bringing well over 3 million visitors each year to come see the presidents carved into the rock. One must-travel route in Custer is the Sylvan Lake Shore Trail. This larger-than-life carving was originally commissioned by James Cook with the planned location in Fort Robinson, Nebraska where Crazy Horse was killed. It's a great place to stop for lunch and a quick browse! Located in a town with under 1,000 people, the 50,000 square-foot Wall Drug is decorated and outfitted like it's still the Old West during the gold rush era. Consider visiting in the fall for cooler weather and better prices. Today, the cave is outfitted with lights and easy-to-walk paths that make it fun to take a guided tour. The best months to travel to South Dakota are generally the milder months with warm weather between May and September. U.S.A. Sept. The Corn Palace Festival happens each year in late August, but if you're not here in time to check it out, there are performances, exhibits, and shows that happen here every month of the year. This massive public park and popular place to visit offers several vantage points of the moving water, including a five-story observation tower. However, the fall is arguably the best time to visit, thanks to the stunning change of color. More than 400,000 tons of rock were blasted from the side of the mountain in its creation. You'll pass 12 overlooks and a few picnic areas on the Badlands Loop Road, which takes you through the North Unit of the park. Every year a new mural of a different theme is constructed of corn and other grains/Johnnie Laws/Shutterstock South Dakota is packed with interesting spots to visit, and the Mitchell Corn Palace is one of the most fun. It's a common basecamp for those interested in exploring the area's monuments, like Mt. Rushmore and the Crazy Horse Memorial, within a scenic hour's drive. Many of the best attractions are in the western part of the state. Note the Needles Highway is closed down during the winter months as snow and ice can make the highway dangerous to drive. The landscapes of South Dakota come with a unique history that adds to the experience of visiting. Dense Black Hills still surround this blast-from-the-past destination, steeped in a rich history still seen on the streets. The Black Hills on the western side of the state define most outdoor adventures. Popular roadside attractions and hikes in Spearfish Canyon include Bridal Veil and the Rough Lock Falls, and the Spearfish Peak and Little Crow Peak. Wall Drugs offers visitors gifts shop, cafeteria, fresh donuts, museum, & lore/Paul R. More than 60 mammoths, including three woolly mammoths, have been discovered at this site. The museum grounds feature several visitor experiences, including the Native American Education and Cultural Center. While the Mount Rushmore National Memorial is the main attraction here, you'll want to spend some time wandering down the scenic trails and walking paths on a guided hike. 10. The site is currently regarded as one of the oldest areas of human history in the country. Check out the Adams Museum to see real gold nuggets, dinosaur fossils, and tour the historic Adams House that still looks like it did in the 1800s in its Victorian grandeur. 16, 2018. After lobbying for the carving's home to be in the Black Hills, the work began and is still underway. This 14-mile route takes you up into the pine and spruce trees atop granite mountains, around Sylan Lake, past wildflower meadows and prairie lands, and amazing needle rock formations. From primitive campsites to electrical and water hookups at RV sites, there are plenty of ways to camp in South Dakota! Be mindful of the Sturgis Rally. A large herd of bison roams freely within the park, adding a unique element to the whole experience. The route leads you through tunnels and overhanging trees in some of South Dakota's most beautiful wilderness for a picture-perfect drive. Expect the highest prices during summer, but this time of year does have the warmest weather. Carved into the side of the mountain are the heads of Presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln, and Theodore Roosevelt. The on-site Ice Age Exhibit Hall displays some of the fossils being found underground. The most famous formation along the route is Needle's Eye, which looks like its namesake and features a small opening at the top of the vertical spike. From famous carvings in granite mountains and Native American ancestral lands to preserved Wild West towns and incredible national and state parks, South Dakota is a nature and history lovers' paradise. It's close to "Sixix Falls" bustling downtown district, making it a convenient and fun stop beyond the natural beauty. Over 2 million people come to visit this old-timey store every year. Visiting South Dakota's wilderness means you may not see a gas station for many miles in some regions, especially if you're heading far out into the Black Hills or Badlands. Scenic drives, like the Needles Highway and Iron Mountain Road, provide easy access to the park with great views along the way. To make the most out of the area, it's recommended to look into some of the best campgrounds near Mount Rushmore. The on-site Indian Museum of North America enriches any visit to Crazy Horse. Visitors are also encouraged to check out weekly classes and events at the Sertoma Butterfly House, including yoga, meditation, and tai-chi in the garden. The lattice structure of boxwork in Wind Cave means the air can easily flow in and out of the caverns, lending this historic and special place its name. The carving, designed by Gutzon Borglum, was begun in 1927, halted for several decades, and finally completed in 1991. The nightlife is awesome with gambling halls, saloons, music, and comedy shows that bring the place to life after dark! 13. Sioux City is also home to several cultural attractions, and anyone visiting should also spend time wandering downtown. The city still has a touch of its wilder days, but much of the fun is centered around families looking to enjoy a South Dakota vacation. There are some truly incredible overlooks and hiking trails to wander within the Badlands National Park at Sheep Mountain Table, the Door Trail, Castle Trail, and Medicine Root Loop. Routes like the Door, Window, and Notch Trails offer an easy hike into the challenging environment. The museum also covers a wide range of historical periods. The monument features Crazy Horse, an Ojigala Lakota Native American, riding a horse among the low pines of the Black Hills. Popular exhibits and activities at the Butterfly House include the Pacific Tide Pool and Shark & Stingray Touch Pool, and the 3,600-square-foot indoor tropical garden that hosts the butterflies. Custer State Park features three lakes: Center, Sylvan, and Legion Lake, where people come to swim and fish in the warmer months, along with 9 campgrounds where you can pitch a tent or pull up an RV with incredible views of the lakes, rolling plains, or cool rock formations. You'll spot buffalo, mule deer, pronghorn, elk, donkeys, coyotes, and eagles if you keep your eyes peeled while you're in the park. Badlands National Park and Mount Rushmore National Memorial can be visited in one day, but you won't get to spend as much time as you need to really appreciate both sites fully. Spearfish Canyon Vivian Fung/Shutterstock Nature and wildlife lovers will appreciate the wilderness and rural appeal of Spearfish Canyon in the Northern Black Hills. You'll be able to browse the museum through different collections, like woodwinds, plucked strings, and percussion along with special instruments played by celebrities and historic figures. If you're going to South Dakota during the warmer months, you'll immerse yourself in the terrain and enjoy your visit more if you can camp out instead of staying in a hotel. Reenactments happen regularly, so if you line up your visit, you'll be able to witness realistic shoutouts, gold panning, gambling, and daily life in the town happening just as they would back in the 1870s. Make a comprehensive itinerary. The interior contains several interesting features, including murals on the walls showing life in an earlier era of South Dakota. The only way to explore Wind Cave is through one of many guided sightseeing tours that take place nearly every day of the year. Frequently Asked Questions Jess Kraft/Shutterstock Wish you had some answers from a travel guru to help figure out your trip to South Dakota? Instead, it's a winding path of roadways and stops that lead down through the state, following the path of the Missouri River along special points of interest from the state's Native American history. Lows can reach single digits in the winter (especially January, the coldest month) that makes camping and enjoying the wilderness in the state less enjoyable. But there's much more to see than what you've probably heard about. Take a self-guided tour through the site, stop at the gift shop, let the kids take a STEAM class, or play at the interactive stream and topographic tables to learn about geology in the area. For those not interested in an underground tour, the above-ground area of the park is also very beautiful, with rolling hills and roaming bison. Check out the Indian Museum of North America, dine at Laughing Water Restaurant, head to the gift shop, and take a tour or stay for a festive event. Today, the Minuteman Missile National Historic Site is one of the U.S. missile silos from the Cold War era and it's right here in South Dakota just north of the Badlands. In the winter, you can rent snowshoes here to get around the park and see it as a winter wonderland! An annual Fort Sisseton Historical Festival happens every June with reenactments featuring cavalry and infantry troops. The Lincoln Borglum Visitor Center on the terrace overlooking the monument is a fun part of any visit. A large herd of bison roams the peaceful landscape, encompassing a staggering 71,000 acres, and Granite peaks tower over the forests, lakes, and streams. And Falls Park is just the tip of things to do in Sioux City. For the more adventurous, there are trails for hiking, biking, and horseback riding. The museum runs events and exhibits on a regular basis so there's always something happening when you visit year-round. The park also maintains over 650 acres of native habitat, including interpretive trails that lead to the Big Sioux River. It's part of the larger Blood Run National Historic Landmark and occupies a lush area that once served as a thriving trading center and gathering place for the Ojoeota people. If you don't have much time but want to see the canyon, drive highway 14A for great views as you travel over the road built on an old railway. Bison in Custer State Park, South DakotaThe outdoors is truly stunning in South Dakota, arguably darker than the most visitors. From themed shopping and dining to an art gallery and local-made treasures, this place has it all. Within these wooded acres, which supported Indigenous populations for thousands of years, are an array of places to visit, like underground caves and larger-than-life monuments. Fill up your tank and stock up on snacks. Mammoth Site Hot Springs, South Dakota, USA 12-27-20 Mammoth Fossil Dig Site/Jacob Boomsma/Shutterstock If you've got some geologists, animal lovers, or history buffs in your group, you'll have to stop by the Mammoth Site in Hot Springs, South Dakota! This is the world's largest mammoth research facility and one of North America's top fossil interpretation sites for the late Ice Age. Wind Cave SamanthaZurbrick/Shutterstock You can visit one of America's oldest national parks at Wind Cave National Park in South Dakota. These allow visitors to experience the environment that has hosted these Native American people for thousands of years. Guided tours are available, giving visitors a glimpse of the excavation process. South Dakota experiences milder weather in the spring (highs in the 40s-70s), summer (upper 70s-mid 80s), and fall (low 40s to mid-70s) with very cold, snowy winters (low 20s-40s). Part of the park (the South Unit) is ancestral Tribal Trust Land belonging to the Oglala Sioux Tribe. The park's namesake and main feature is the intricate and winding Wind Cave that's full of boxwork — thin calcite "blades" or fins that intersect to form rock structures that look like honeycomb. Visitors can see partially uncovered mammoth bones shown as they were found, in a covered, climate-controlled building. Chief Henry Standing Bear, a relative of Crazy Horse, wrote to Cook and explained that the location of the monument should be in Paha Sapa (Black Hills), the ancestral lands of his people. 11. Tour the Delta-01 Launch Control Facility (or watch an e-tour), see a real nuclear missile, check out exhibits in the lobby, exterior, and deep underground in bomb shelter basements. If you're hoping to make it to some of the best places to visit in South Dakota, you'll want a working itinerary with your stops ordered in a way that efficiently gets you from place to place. The new Under the Dock exhibit illustrates in a fun way the wide world of aquatic life never too far away. Admission is free, although donations are accepted. You can visit the natural entrance with signage that teaches you about the spiritual significance of the cave to the Lakota people. Grab a bite to eat at the Western Art Gallery Restaurant while you check out paintings and illustrations, pose with massive Mount Rushmore and dinosaur replicas, let the kids play in the "backyard" area, and shop for souvenirs made by local tribes. While Mount Rushmore is often a defining feature of a South Dakota vacation, most people only spend about a half day at the monument. Roughlock and Spearfish Falls are slightly harder to reach, but just as incredible. The needle formations are tall, skinny rocks that have been eroded and shaped by wind, water, and cold. We've hand-picked what we consider to be the best things to do in South Dakota, hidden gems and all! 1.
